


Data Source


- Data: Based on U.S. Census Bureau's 2008 American Community Survey (ACS) Public Use Microdata Sample (PUMS).
- Population: Includes the household population and people living in non-institutional group quarters, such as dormitories and group homes.
- Sample: 2.9 million persons in the U.S., weighted to a total population of 300 million.



US Prevalence Rate (all ages)




Does not include

Overall Disability

Reporting ***one or more*** of the six disability types:

- Visual
- Hearing
- Ambulatory
- Cognitive
- Self-Care
- Independent living



ACS 2008 Disability questions

Hearing Disability (All ages):


Is this person deaf or does he/she have serious difficulty hearing?

Vision Disability (All ages):

Is this person blind or does he/she have serious difficulty seeing even when wearing glasses?

Cognitive Disability (Ages 5+):

Because of a physical, mental, or emotional condition, does this person have serious difficulty concentrating, remembering, or making decisions?



ACS 2008 Disability questions (cont.)

Ambulatory Disability (Ages 5+):


Does this person have serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs?

Self-Care Disability (Ages 5+):

Does this person have difficulty dressing or bathing?


Independent Living Disability (Ages 15+):

Because of a physical, mental, or emotional condition, does this person have difficulty doing errands alone such as visiting a doctors office or shopping?




Prevalence Rate (Upper Midwest, ages 21-64)






Number of Persons with Disabilities by State






Prevalence Rate by Type of Disability






Employment Rate of Persons with Disabilities













Employment Rates by Disability Type

Persons with Disabilities: Not working, but actively looking for work (Upper Midwest, ages 21-64)







Median Annual Household Income

- HHs with People with Disabilities







Poverty Gap

(Upper Midwest, ages 21-64)



Educational Attainment Disparities








Working-Age Civilian Veterans with a Service-Connected Disability








Health Insurance Coverage: Persons with Disabilities






Summary:


Nearly one in six working age persons living in the upper Midwest have a disability (2.8 Million)

- Employed at half the rate of persons without disabilities
- Household income is a third less than households without persons with disabilities
- Over a quarter are living below the poverty line
- One in five didn't graduate from high school
- One in six have no health insurance





2008 Disability Status Reports U.S., 50 states, D.C., Puerto Rico






2008 Disability Status Report Topics


